We are sorry to inform you that due to recent budget restraints the Coffey County Historical Museum will not be having its annual Pioneer Days in 2008. The museum will try to hold Pioneer Days in 2009 and every odd numbered year thereafter.

Corrections to History, Heritage and Home Cooking Recipe Book

The staff at the museum spent many months typing, proofing, retyping and reproofing the entire recipe book. We knew when we finished we were going to find errors no matter how hard we tried not to make any. We were right. The first error is on page 8. Festive Cheese Ball submitted by Deborah Kennamore, Burlington, should have 1 pkg. (10-oz.) sharp cheddar cheese and parsley added to the ingredients section.

The second error is on page 130. Grandma Perry's Donuts submitted by Mrs. Don Perry in memory of Mrs. F.J. (Mary) Perry, Lebo should have the last line in the family history/ memory section read "Her family recalls the time she supervised a junior class in making and selling more than 120 dozen donuts on one Saturday!"

The third error is on page 112. Classic Cheesecake submitted by Deborah Kennamore, Burlington

should have "3 eggs" listed in the ingredients section.

The fourth error is on page 287. Gourmet Potatoes submitted by Shirley Gorge, Burlington needs to have an addition to the end of the instruction paragraph "Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes".
