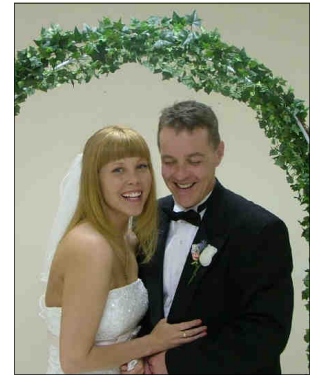
I Got Married!!!!

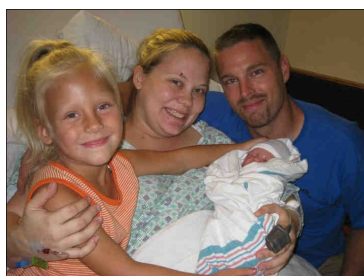

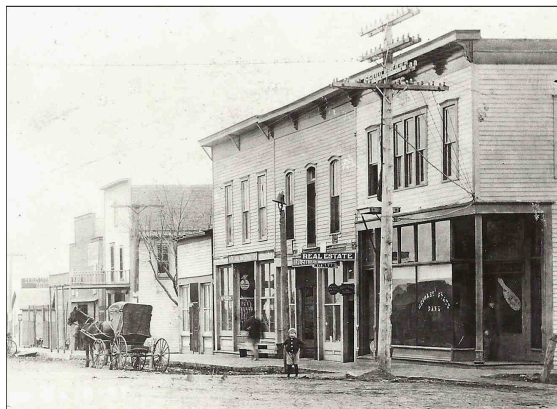
